

NEW ARC ACADEMY ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

Technology is used to support teaching and learning at the University of Delaware’s (UD) New Arc Academy (NAA). Camp participants and NAA staff are expected to demonstrate responsible use of technology, consistent with the goals and policies of the New Arc Academy. This policy provides participant guidelines for the use of all computers, mobile devices, networks, and the Internet at the New Arc Academy.

Camp participants who use technology and their parents must sign this Acceptable Use Policy, to verify that they comply with this policy.

ACCEPTABLE USE BY STUDENTS

- The use of technology by students must be consistent with the academic goals of the New Arc Academy.

UNACCEPTABLE USES BY PARTICIPANTS

- The damage to and/or willful neglect of computers, software, networks or other technology equipment is prohibited.
- The use of technology to cause harm or offend others is prohibited.
- The use of technology to access or distribute obscene or pornographic material is prohibited.
- The use of technology for profit, illegal or commercial purposes is unacceptable.
- The illegal or malicious use of technology is prohibited.
- Using technology to reveal personal information such as addresses, telephone numbers, credit card numbers, and social security numbers is prohibited.
- The violation of copyright laws is prohibited.
- The installation or use of copyrighted or unlicensed software or files from any source is prohibited.
- Files stored on network storage shares for the NAA are not private. Network administrators may review files, folders, etc. to ensure that the system is being used responsibly. The unauthorized access by camp participants to network settings, usernames and passwords and other people’s work is prohibited.

REMEDIAL ACTION

- Inappropriate use or vandalism by participants will result in the cancellation of user privileges for the duration of the camp. In addition, participants and their families may be held liable and charged for any repairs resulting from vandalism or willful misconduct.
